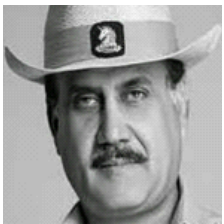


PROMINENT SPEAKERS



Robert Peacock

Vice-President of the World Society of Victimology and Professor in the Department of Criminology at the University of the Free State (UFS). He is the recipient of a number of awards (for instance honorary academic colours, media publication awards, study and teaching) and serves regularly on scientific committees and boards. He has been working actively in the field of victimology with child justice and institutional victimisation as particular focus areas seeking to advance justice on the African continent and elsewhere, focusing on the plight of disenfranchised and marginal individuals, groups and communities.



Lt. General Ajay Kumar Singh

After a distinguished service in the Armed Forces, Lt Gen A.K. Singh was entrusted with the responsibility of Administrator/Lt Governor of A&N Islands in July, 2013 and later concurrently assumed the charge of Lt Governor of Puducherry in July, 2014. Lt. General Ajay Kumar Singh is the former Lieutenant Governor of Andaman and Nicobar Islands. He is former Commander in Chief of Southern Command of Indian Army. Presently he is an advisor to the O P Jindal University.



Michael O Connell

Michael O'Connell is the Commissioner for Victims' Rights. Before his appointment as Commissioner, Michael was South Australia's first Victims of Crime Co-ordinator. Previously, he served for over 20 years as a police officer during which he was the inaugural Victim Impact Statement Co-ordinator. He co-chairs the National Victims of Crime Working Group, which developed the National Framework on Victims' Rights and Victim Assistance. He as well is a member of the Sentencing Advisory Council in South Australia. As a Commissioner for Victims' Rights and as a member of the Executive for the World Society of Victimology, Michael has spoken at side-events at the UN Commission on Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice (2009, 2014), and spoken at ancillary meetings at the UN Crime Congress (2010) as well as the high-level segment of the UN Economic and Social Council (2012).



Shekhar Dutt

Mr. Dutta is a retired IAS officer and former Governor of Chhattisgarh, in addition to being the Chancellor of eleven State Universities and visitor of six private universities. Before this, between 2007 & 2010, Shri Dutta also served as the Deputy National Security Advisor wherein he addressed the issues concerning Strategic Defence and National Security. He also served as the Defence Secretary, Government of India. Prior to that, he was the Secretary Defence Production, where his role encompassed overseeing and facilitating production of military land, sea and air systems. Shri Dutta has also held numerous prestigious positions during his vast career span, namely Director General at Sports Authority of India, Secretary, Ministry of Health, in the Madhya Pradesh Government, he was Principal Secretary at the Tribal Welfare, as well as Principal Secretary at Departments of School Education, Sports & Youth Welfare. Prior to that, he was Joint Secretary at the Ministry of Defence. Shri Dutta originally started his career as an army officer and fought the 1971 Indo Pak War and was awarded the Sena Medal for gallantry.



Elmar Weitekamp

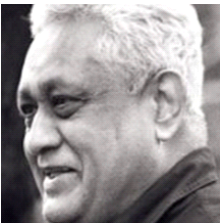

Prof G S Bajpai serves as the Registrar, National Law University, Delhi. Professor of Criminology & Criminal Justice; Chair Professor at K.L Arora Chair in Criminal Law at National Law University, Delhi and also as the Chairperson at the Centre for Criminology & Victimology. He Prof. Bajpai held many prestigious international assignments for advanced research in criminal law and criminal justice. Prof. Bajpai was conferred a visiting fellowship under the Indo-NWO Exchange of scholars and under this visit he carried out significant research at the International Victimology Institute, Faculty of Law, University of Tilburg in the Netherlands. Apart from visiting the International Criminal Court at Hague, Prof Bajpai delivered key lectures in several universities like VU University, Amsterdam. He is presently teaching of BA LL B /LL M courses; undertaking need based research projects, offering consultancies; advocacy in the area of victim assistance; conduct of training in the legal research method and carrying out overseas collaborations with selected universities.
